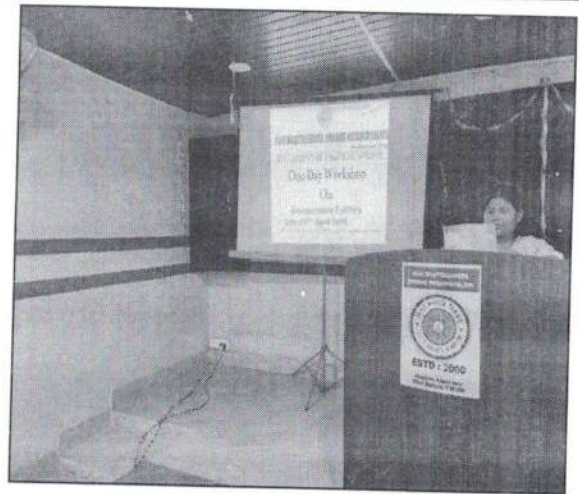
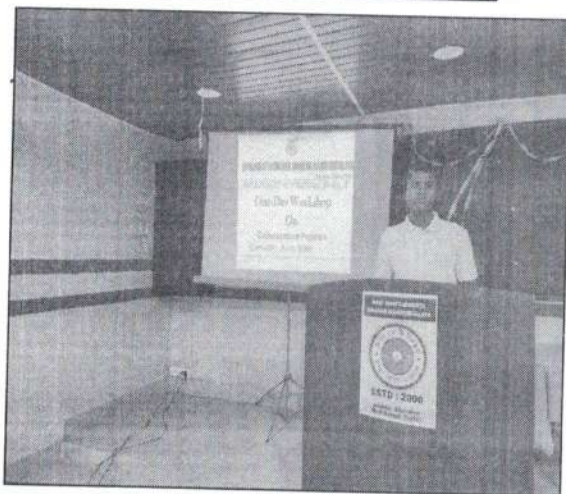
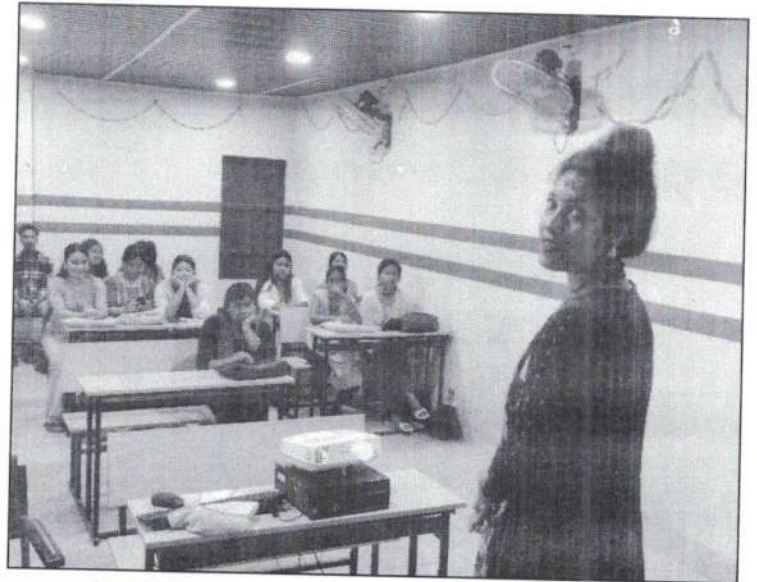
Object:
