# **<u>1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY</u>**

# **1.1 INTRODUCTION**

Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya, established in 2000 in Jaigaon near the Indo-Bhutan border, was founded to address the increasing demand for higher education in the area. Prior to its inception, students had to travel nearly seventy kilometers to reach colleges in Alipurduar or Birpara. The college is the sole higher education institution in the Kalchini block, which stretches from Jaigaon to Kalchini, and it is situated in a picturesque locale overlooking the Toorsa River, the Bhutanese side of the Himalayas, and lush green forests.

Beginning with just 34 students, the college's foundation was laid through the persistent efforts of local residents, political leaders, and the West Bengal government. Initially housed in a building provided by the Toorsa Tea Garden, the college relocated to its permanent site at Ramgaon, Jaigaon, in 2005. Over the next fifteen years, the college sought funds from various government departments to enhance its infrastructure. Significant progress was made when the West Bengal government allocated approximately seven crores for a new building, with the North Bengal Development Department (NBDD) overseeing its construction. The new facility was inaugurated on April 6, 2023, and has been operational since April 2024.

laborers. Given this demographic, the college's mission must be practical and aligned with the real needs of its students. Teachers are expected to understand and adapt to this context. The college's mission is not merely to offer idealistic intellectual pursuits but to empower students to secure their rightful place in India's economic, social, and political landscape. Our goal is to help those who have been on the periphery of literacy to overcome their challenges and actively contribute to nation-building.

# 1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

# Institutional Strength

1. Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya (NBSM) promotes a co-educational and interdisciplinary approach, creating an inclusive environment that celebrates religio-cultural diversity.

2. Transparency is central to all college operations, encompassing financial, academic, administrative, and operational practices.

3. The admission process is fully online and merit-based, adhering to government guidelines.

4. The eco-friendly campus, spanning 4 acres, emphasizes environmental awareness and sustainability.

5. A vibrant herbal garden enhances biodiversity and serves as an educational resource on medicinal plants and sustainable practices.

6. Security is prioritized with defined campus boundaries, dedicated security personnel, and an extensive CCTV network for comprehensive surveillance.

7. The campus maintains a strict anti-ragging policy, ensuring a safe and respectful environment for all students.

8. Active participation in community service is encouraged through regular activities organized by the NSS Unit.

9. Classrooms are equipped with portable ICT facilities to enrich learning experiences.

10. The college features a fully-equipped computer laboratory.

11. Collaborations with other institutions enhance the academic environment through faculty and student exchanges, and joint initiatives such as seminars, workshops, skill development programs, and cultural and sports events.

12. Various scholarships are available, including Kanyashree, Aikyashree, Oasis, SVMCM (HES), and Free Studentships.

13. The curriculum is enriched with Add-on courses that expand educational opportunities.

14. The well-stocked, automated library features resources like N-List and utilizes systems such as KOHA for efficient access and management.

- 15. Regular soft skills development and yoga classes support student well-being and personal growth.
- 16. Career counseling services provide guidance for opportunities in both public and private sectors.
- 17. Campus-wide Wi-Fi connectivity ensures access to online resources throughout the campus.
- 18. An on-site canteen caters to the dietary needs of the college community.
- 19. The college actively supports cultural activities and sports, fostering a well-rounded campus life.

#### **Institutional Weakness**

1. The college's rural and remote location significantly limits access and opportunities for students.

2. The introduction of professional courses is challenging due to the limited affordability among the majority of students.

3. General poverty in the area and a lack of parental education and awareness act as barriers to higher education for many aspiring first-generation learners.

4. The college urgently needs permanent teaching and non-teaching staff, exacerbated by the slow government recruitment process.

5. A shortage of sanctioned faculty posts increases the workload on existing teachers, hindering their ability to engage in research and leading to limited research output.

6. Poor performance in NET/SET and competitive exams among students negatively impacts their placement prospects.

7. Increased involvement and support from alumni are essential to address challenges and enhance institutional support.

8. The lack of nearby industries and the disinterest of existing ones in active industry-institution collaboration present significant limitations.

9. Limited collaborative activities and interdisciplinary research within the institute and with other institutions and industry partners impede academic growth.

10. Scarcity of on-campus consultative and placement opportunities, due to lack of interest from reputed organizations, demotivates students.

11. Language barriers among students affect their job prospects and overall academic performance.

12. The absence of science and commerce streams, student hostels, and staff quarters are additional deficiencies that need to be addressed.

13. Increased funding from more agencies is necessary to strengthen infrastructure and improve the overall

quality of education and facilities at the college.

## **Institutional Opportunity**

1. The college's location in a backward catchment area provides a unique opportunity to offer higher education to marginalized sections of society.

2. The COVID-19 pandemic has created an opportunity to reinvent ICT-supported teaching and learning methods, enabling both students and teachers to adapt to e-learning and digital content.

3. There is a potential to introduce more skill-based programs to enhance students' employability.

4. Opportunities exist for research focused on Indian knowledge systems, local culture, language, and art forms.

5. The introduction of interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary courses presents a valuable opportunity for academic enrichment.

6. There is potential to introduce science streams to diversify educational offerings.

7. There is scope to generate employment opportunities through enhanced industry-institution interactions.

8. The Alumni Association can play a crucial role in academic affairs and career counseling, strengthening the college's social capital.

9. Given its rural location, the college can leverage community engagement opportunities to promote health awareness and address social issues.

#### **Institutional Challenge**

1. Introducing a science stream remains a significant challenge due to the absence of higher secondary schools in the catchment area to provide a feeder system.

2. The limited range of disciplines restricts the effective implementation of the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS), leaving students with few options for elective courses.

3. Insufficient infrastructure, remote location, and a lack of funding discourage teachers from engaging in serious research activities.

4. Meeting global academic standards is challenging due to the college's remoteness, backwardness, and limited resources.

5. Conducting online programs and teaching activities is difficult due to poor internet connectivity.

6. Dropout rates among program course students, primarily due to poverty, pose a severe challenge.

7. Securing placements for students in a restricted environment is an arduous task.

8. The lack of financial resources relative to the needs for maintenance and growth presents a significant challenge.

# **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

## **Curricular Aspects**

Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya (NBSM) is dedicated to delivering quality higher education and fostering holistic student development. Each academic session begins with a comprehensive calendar published on the college website, which guides departments in planning their activities. A thorough orientation session introduces new students to the syllabus, evaluation methods, and faculty, ensuring a smooth transition into college life.

The college prepares a master routine based on university credit points and communicates this through departmental notice boards and WhatsApp groups. Classes blend traditional methods with digital tools, supported by an optimal mentor-mentee ratio and extensive library resources. Study materials and past exam papers are provided, with continuous assessments including tests, assignments, and group discussions helping to monitor student progress. Remedial classes are organized for slower learners to improve their performance.

NBSM's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducts student satisfaction surveys to refine teaching methods and processes. The institution aligns with the University of North Bengal's curriculum, with faculty contributing to curriculum enhancements. Beyond academics, NBSM promotes holistic development through sports, NSS activities, cultural programs, and certificate courses. Effective communication is maintained via WhatsApp groups, the college website, and social media.

The college integrates key crosscutting themes into its curriculum, including Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, and Environment and Sustainability. Professional ethics are emphasized through case studies and discussions, preparing students for ethical decision-making in their careers. Gender equality is promoted through workshops and gender studies programs, fostering an inclusive environment. Human values like compassion and respect are reinforced through various activities. Environmental education is embedded in the curriculum, with initiatives such as tree planting and plastic eradication drives.

NBSM's commitment to these themes and its holistic approach to education aim to develop students into wellrounded individuals equipped to contribute positively to society. Feedback from students is collected, analyzed, and communicated to relevant bodies, ensuring continuous improvement and transparency.

### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya (NBSM) emphasizes interactive and innovative teaching methods to foster critical thinking and experiential learning. The institution integrates tools like audio-visual aids, Google Classroom, fieldwork, and projects to create engaging learning environments. ICT tools enhance student interaction with e-journals, GPS for research, and online report submissions. Post-pandemic, NBSM has incorporated internships and apprenticeships, with digital tools supporting various departmental activities such as drama productions and Youth Parliament sessions. Practical components, including industrial visits and

museum trips, enrich the curriculum.

NBSM is committed to inclusivity, offering support to economically disadvantaged and first-generation learners through customized curricula and induction programs. The institution ensures tailored guidance via assessments, mentor-mentee groups, and a variety of evaluation methods like tests, projects, and assignments. Wi-Fi and online resources facilitate learning, with the library providing access to e-resources and Open Educational Resources (OERs).

The college adheres to the University of North Bengal's assessment guidelines within the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). Weightage includes 20% internal assessment and 80% end-semester examinations for theoretical courses, and 60% internal and 40% external for practical courses. Attendance impacts marks, and internal assessment scores are submitted online. The college adapted to online examinations during the COVID-19 pandemic, maintaining communication through parent-teacher meetings and addressing grievances via a Grievance Redressal Committee.

Outcome-Based Learning (OBL) is central to NBSM's approach, with clearly defined Program Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) communicated to students. The educational strategy focuses on domain knowledge, communication skills, and awareness of social and environmental issues. Regular feedback and academic audits ensure continuous improvement. Career-Oriented Programs and Faculty Development Programs support skill enhancement and teaching quality. Feedback from students and alumni helps evaluate program effectiveness.

The college's structured approach to syllabus distribution, attendance monitoring, and continuous assessment ensures comprehensive evaluation. Indirect methods like student feedback complement direct evaluations. NBSM's commitment to innovation, inclusivity, and practical learning prepares students for academic and professional success. The pass percentage over the last five years is 76.29%.

Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya (NBSM) spans 8093.71 square meters across 4 acres, providing extensive space for academic and extracurricular activities. The campus includes academic buildings, sports facilities, and areas for student engagement, reflecting a commitment to holistic education.

**Safety and Surveillance:** The college prioritizes safety with a network of CCTV cameras and fire extinguishing systems, ensuring a secure environment for students, staff, and visitors.

**Sustainability and Environmental Initiatives:** NBSM is dedicated to sustainability, featuring a rooftop solar panel system, a rainwater harvesting system, and effective waste management practices.

**Classrooms and Facilities:** The college has 25+ classrooms, each under CCTV surveillance, a seminar and cultural hall, two virtual classrooms with projectors, and a Geography lab. The library supports academic needs with a vast collection of books and resources, while a power generator and a sick room ensure uninterrupted operations and medical care.

ICT Facilities: NBSM offers robust ICT resources, including 50 computers for academic purposes, 40 for student use, and 10 for staff. The college is equipped with 6 projectors, 3 laptops, 47 desktops, 47 UPS units, and 7 printers. Wi-Fi connectivity with 150 Mbps bandwidth supports digital learning, and the library includes computers and access to N-LIST e-resources. The college website is managed by "Easy Solution."

**Cultural Activities & Sports:** The college organizes cultural events and academic seminars in a well-equipped hall and promotes physical fitness through a gymnasium. Students participate in district and state-level sports, showcasing their achievements.

**Library and IT Infrastructure:** The library is well-furnished, partially automated with KOHA ILMS, and features RFID technology. It houses over 7,500 books and provides access to N-LIST. The college has enhanced IT infrastructure, including increased internet bandwidth from 2 Mbps to 150 Mbps, and invests in modern IT hardware and software. Maintenance is ensured through annual contracts and dedicated technical support.

**Benefits:** Upgraded IT facilities boost productivity, improve security, foster innovation, enhance attractiveness, and provide a superior user experience. The student-computer ratio is 54.04:1, reflecting a strong focus on digital resources.

NBSM's comprehensive infrastructure supports a dynamic and secure educational environment, aligning with its commitment to academic excellence and technological advancement.

#### **Student Support and Progression**

Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya (NBSM) supports its students through various scholarships and freeships, benefiting 65.98% of students over the past five years. The institution prioritizes capacity development by organizing activities to enhance students' soft skills, language and communication skills, life skills (such as Yoga and physical fitness), and ICT/computing skills. However, only 6.63% of students have benefited from guidance for competitive exams and career counseling offered by the college.

The college maintains a robust grievance redressal mechanism to address student concerns, including sexual harassment and ragging cases. This involves adhering to statutory guidelines, promoting awareness of zero-tolerance policies, providing online and offline grievance submission options, and ensuring timely resolution through designated committees.

The NBSM Alumni Association, though not officially registered, plays a vital role in connecting past and present students. With around 50 registered members, the association is active in organizing events that support both alumni and current students. Its vision includes fostering knowledge exchange, providing mentorship, collaborating with various organizations, and engaging alumni in college activities.

The association's key contributions include organizing gender awareness programs that improve campus inclusivity and culture. These workshops offer valuable insights and foster dialogue on gender issues, benefiting the entire college community.

Through these initiatives, NBSM enhances its educational environment and community engagement, demonstrating a commitment to holistic student development and a strong connection with its alumni.

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	Our college has adopted a comprehensive and interdisciplinary educational strategy aimed at developing well-rounded individuals. This approach focuses on nurturing a diverse set of skills—academic, intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and ethical—within an integrated framework. Departments such as English, Bengali, Hindi, Nepali, History, Political Science, Education, and Philosophy collaborate to foster a dynamic and cohesive learning environment. For example, the Philosophy department offers a course on "Mental Wellness & Yoga," which integrates knowledge from various disciplines. Additionally, Humanities departments contribute to the curriculum with certificate courses and specialized programs that emphasize skill development and personal growth. In line with the National Education Policy (NEP), the college has introduced vocational and professional training courses, such as Yoga and Self-Defense, underscoring their interdisciplinary relevance. Our Career Counselling Cell conducts workshops and seminars to prepare students for the job market, while the NSS units foster social responsibility. We are committed to applying this multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approach across all undergraduate programs, including basic, professional, and vocational disciplines, to support comprehensive student development. Moreover, the college provides distance learning options through IGNOU and Netaji Subhash Open University, including a PG course in Hindi. We also focus on practical learning experiences through internships with local industries and businesses, enhancing students' practical
	and businesses, enhancing students' practical knowledge and career readiness.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya is actively preparing to implement the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system as outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP). This innovative academic framework will offer undergraduate students multiple entry and exit points throughout their courses, allowing them to balance education with employment opportunities and potentially reducing dropout rates. Under this system, students can exit a program after achieving any level of qualification and return later to complete their studies within a specified timeframe. The ABC system promotes a blended learning approach, enabling students to earn credits from

various higher education institutions registered with the scheme through platforms like SWAYAM, MOOCs, and NPTEL. To support this, Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya encourages both faculty and students to engage with these national platforms, enhancing their academic and practical knowledge. While awaiting authorization from the relevant authorities, we have initiated discussions with our affiliating university to incorporate the ABC system into our skill-oriented programs as a preliminary step. Additionally, we have signed Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with several institutions and are exploring both traditional and online channels to maximize the benefits of ABC for our students and those from other colleges within a unified system. Implementing the ABC system at the degree level will necessitate extensive collaboration among institutions and regulatory bodies. It holds the potential to revolutionize credit transfer across universities and recognize credits earned through non-traditional courses. Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya has partnered with numerous academic and research institutes to offer a range of certificate programs and value-added courses, aligning with the core objectives of the ABC system. Our affiliating university's admission advisory has highlighted the forthcoming introduction of ABC, emphasizing its importance for modernizing and enhancing the flexibility of higher education. To facilitate a smooth transition to ABC, we have established our own digital locker system where students have begun entering necessary details. Since 2021, we have been considering forming clusters with other colleges to further benefit our students and potentially implement ABC through these collaborative networks. By registering on e-learning platforms such as SWAYAM, NPTEL, and other MOOC sites, our students are positioned to gain substantial advantages. Moreover, many of our faculty members have registered on these platforms to mentor and assist students, enriching our educational environment. The implementation of the ABC system at Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya represents a transformative step towards a more flexible and inclusive educational framework. By embracing blended learning, enhancing credit transfer mechanisms, and fostering collaborations, we aim to

	provide our students with a robust, adaptable, and comprehensive education that effectively prepares them for the future.
3. Skill development:	The National Education Policy (NEP) emphasizes the holistic development of youth, focusing on both increasing the Gross Enrollment Ratio and enhancing skill development to support the objectives of Atmanirbhar Bharat. In alignment with this vision, our institution, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), has implemented several initiatives aimed at enriching both knowledge and soft skills among students. Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya continuously evolves by integrating new concepts, theories, and technological advances into its strategic planning while remaining deeply rooted in foundational values and beliefs. In addition to our core curriculum, we offer sixteen Certificate/Addon/Value-Added courses that impart knowledge of Indian heritage, scientific advancements, and professional skill development. These courses also foster a deep appreciation for national and regional cultures and heritages. This comprehensive educational approach ensures that our students are well-equipped to contribute meaningfully to both local and global communities.

By implementing the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP) through the newly introduced Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP), our institution customizes education to align with students' interests, abilities, and skill development, promoting participative and innovative learning. Our educational framework is structured into planning, doing, checking, and acting stages, ensuring that academic plans align with the Mahavidyalaya's mission and vision. Course Outcomes (COs) and Programme Outcomes (POs) are designed to meet North Bengal University's objectives. We employ innovative teaching methods such as ICT-based teaching, extension lectures, seminars, workshops, field trips, group discussions, quizzes, and student-led presentations. # **1.1 Curricular Planning and Implementation**

# 1.1.1

The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

## **Response:**

At the commencement of each academic session, the institution diligently prepares and publishes an academic calendar on the college website. This calendar, developed annually or each semester in accordance with notifications from the University of North Bengal and the Higher Education Department of the Government of West Bengal, outlines all key academic activities. Serving as a guiding document, the calendar aids departments in planning and regularly updating their respective activities, which are displayed on departmental notice boards.

To acclimate newly enrolled students, a comprehensive orientation session is conducted at the beginning of every academic session or semester. This session introduces students to the syllabus, internal evaluation methods, examination systems, and departmental faculty, ensuring a smooth transition into college life.

The routine committee prepares the master routine, strictly adhering to the credit points outlined in the university syllabus for each course. Once finalized, each department communicates its specific routine to students through departmental notice boards and official WhatsApp groups, fostering clarity and organization.

Classes are conducted using a blend of traditional lecture methods, PowerPoint presentations, and audiovisual aids, supplemented by online teaching platforms when appropriate. Departments maintain an optimal mentor-mentee ratio, with curriculum plans designed to achieve key learning outcomes. The college library further supports students by offering essential textbooks and reference materials to enhance classroom instruction.

Upon the completion of each unit, study materials are distributed to students. To familiarize them with end-semester examination patterns, past exam papers are shared and reviewed. Continuous assessments, including class tests, viva voce, seminars, assignments, group discussions, and field visits or surveys, allow for the consistent evaluation of student progress. Regular assessments also help identify slower learners, prompting the administration to organize remedial classes to boost their performance.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) administers a student satisfaction survey to refine teaching and learning processes across departments. The college's mission is to develop students into knowledgeable, morally grounded individuals who will contribute positively to society.

As an affiliated institution, we adhere to the curriculum prescribed by the University of North Bengal. Our faculty members actively participate in the University's Board of Studies, ensuring the curriculum is continually enhanced and adapted to modern academic needs.

Beyond academics, the institution emphasizes the holistic development of students through a variety of co-curricular activities, including indoor and outdoor sports, NSS activities, inter-college competitions, wall magazines, cultural programs, student seminars, group discussions, and Youth Parliament Competitions. To further enrich students' knowledge, the institution also offers a range of certificate add-on courses and special lectures.

### **2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms**

### 2.5.1

### **Response:**

As an affiliated college, our assessment and evaluation processes adhere strictly to the rules and

regulations set forth by the University of North Bengal (NBU) to ensure outcome-based learning within the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) pattern, implemented since the Academic Session 2018-2019 alongside the Annual System. Below is an overview of our assessment mechanism:

### **1. Weightage Distribution:**

- Theoretical Courses: 20% internal assessment, 80% End Semester Examinations (ESE).
- **Practical-based Courses:** 60% internal assessment, 40% ESE.

### 2. Continuous Internal Assessment:

• Conducted in multiple phases, employing diverse evaluation methods such as MCQs, projects, objective type questions, Open Book Mode, viva voce, student seminars, and assignments.

### **3. Attendance Requirement:**

- A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory to appear in examinations.
- Marks are awarded based on attendance as follows:
- 75% and above but below 80%: 02 marks
- 80% and above but below 85%: 03 marks
- 85% and above but below 90%: 04 marks
- 90% and above: 05 marks

### 4. Internal Assessment Breakup:

- 10 marks are allocated for internal assessment.
- 5 marks are assigned for attendance.

### **5. Online Submission and Transparency:**

- Internal assessment marks are submitted online via the Marks Capture Portal of NBU.
- External assessments are conducted per university guidelines, with external examiners appointed by the University.

### 6. Adaptation to Online Mode During COVID-19 Pandemic:

- Examination modalities were shifted to the online mode to ensure continuity.
- Faculty provided continuous guidance to students.
- Marks were promptly uploaded to the University portal.

### 7. Parent-Teacher Meetings:

• Conducted every semester, with online meetings held during the pandemic to keep parents informed about student progress and identify any additional support needed.

### 8. Grievance Redressal Mechanism:

• A Grievance and Redressal Committee has been established to provide a transparent

mechanism for reporting complaints and grievances.

• The committee meets regularly to address and resolve student grievances promptly and effectively.

Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya (NBSM) spans over 8093.71 square meters of land, out of a total of 4 acres, providing ample space for both academic and extracurricular activities. This includes academic buildings as well as outdoor areas dedicated to sports, gatherings, and student activities, reflecting the college's commitment to offering a well-rounded educational experience. The infrastructure of the college blends academic rigor with opportunities for extracurricular engagement, fostering a conducive environment for student growth.

### Safety and Surveillance

To ensure the safety and security of students, staff, and visitors, the college is equipped with fire extinguishing systems and a comprehensive network of CCTV cameras strategically placed throughout the campus. This extensive surveillance system deters misconduct and enhances overall security, creating a safe and secure learning environment.

### Sustainability and Environmental Initiatives

NBSM is committed to sustainability, demonstrated by its rooftop solar panel system that significantly reduces the college's carbon footprint. Additionally, the campus features a rainwater harvesting system that efficiently conserves water by collecting and utilizing rainwater. Proper waste management systems are also in place, ensuring that waste is segregated and disposed of in an environmentally responsible manner.

### **Classrooms and Additional Facilities**

The college features 25 + classrooms, each under 25 CCTV surveillance to maintain a safe and secure learning environment. The classrooms are designed to facilitate effective teaching and learning. A dedicated seminar and cultural hall provides a space for academic discussions and cultural enrichment. Two virtual classrooms are equipped with projectors to support modern, interactive teaching methods. A well-equipped Geography lab offers practical, hands-on learning experiences, and the college's library, stocked with a vast collection of books, meets the academic needs of students and faculty.

Additionally, the college has a power generator to ensure an uninterrupted power supply during outages and a sick room for immediate medical attention when needed.

### **ICT Facilities**

NBSM provides students and faculty with 50 computers for academic purposes, 40 for student general use, and 10 designated for teaching & office Staff. There are 6 projectors available for instructional use. The college is equipped with Wi-Fi connectivity, offering a bandwidth of 100 MBPS through Alliance Broadband. The institution possesses 3 laptops, 47 desktops, 47 UPS units, and 7 printers. Six room is specially equipped with LCD projectors, a screen, and a sound system to facilitate seminars and presentations. One Language Lab.

The IQAC room, teachers' common room, and administrative block each have computers to support their functions, and the library features 3 computers—1 for the librarian and 2 at the circulation desk. The library also provides access to the N-LIST facility, which offers e-journals, e-books, and other e-learning resources. Faculty members are registered on the VIDWAN portal to improve academic connectivity. The college website is professionally maintained by "Easy Solution" through an annual maintenance contract.

These advancements bolster security, streamline resource management, and optimize daily operations, ensuring the library functions efficiently.

This collection includes syllabus-oriented textbooks and reference materials, all accessible through an open-access system. #### **Response:**

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya (NBSM) plays a pivotal role in enhancing the overall quality of academic and administrative processes within the institution. It contributes to the regulation, curriculum development, and syllabus formulation by defining Course Outcomes (COs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs), implementing the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), and providing mentoring, tutorials, and remedial classes for both slow and advanced learners. This ensures inclusive education for all students. IQAC also establishes and applies quality benchmarks for academic and administrative activities through regular interactions with stakeholders, and it organizes induction programs for students and parents to ensure the smooth functioning of academic activities. The cell actively conducts inter and intra-institutional workshops and seminars, focusing on quality-related themes, fostering collaboration through study circles, exchange programs, and internships.

In addition to these initiatives, IQAC arranges internal supplementary examinations to support students' academic progress and success. It monitors faculty progress under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) according to UGC guidelines, maintaining detailed records through the CAS committee. Furthermore, IQAC members liaise with the University of North Bengal's Board of Studies (BOS) to nominate faculty members for workshops, aligning curriculum and syllabus with the CBCS model. Innovative pedagogical approaches such as project-based learning, self-learning, industrial internships,

and peer-assisted learning are introduced by the IQAC, aligning with the objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

The IQAC also monitors teaching and learning processes, conducting regular academic sub-committee meetings to review methodologies and learning outcomes. Orientation and induction programs for newly admitted students are organized under the IQAC's guidance, ensuring students receive essential information about the college, courses, and examination procedures. The cell facilitates an annual Academic Administrative Audit, encompassing both internal and external audits to ensure compliance and quality assurance. During the pandemic, the IQAC promoted ICT-enabled teaching by organizing workshops and training sessions for teachers, facilitating online teaching, and disseminating e-content. It established a YouTube channel for lectures, provided e-content via the college website, and offered scanned books from the library to students upon request. A dedicated Facebook page was also created to document college events.

Additionally, the IQAC introduced skill-oriented courses and free add-on programs for students, transitioning these offerings smoothly to online mode during the pandemic. It refined existing programs such as Yoga classes and introduced new certificate courses. Through these concerted efforts, the IQAC has institutionalized quality assurance strategies across various domains, fostering a culture of continuous improvement and excellence at NBSM, ensuring that the college remains a leading higher education institution in the region.

# Title of The Practice: - Coping with Online Learning

# **Objective of The Practice:**

With the abrupt shift to online learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic, colleges nationwide faced the challenge of transitioning face-to-face classes to online formats. For teachers, skill development was essential to adapt quickly and maintain technological competencies. For students, navigating online platforms, interacting with digital learning environments, and self-regulating their learning became critical in the absence of physical infrastructure and face-to-face interactions. In this context, fostering communication and collaboration between teachers and students was crucial for successfully adopting online platforms.

# The primary objectives of this practice were:

- To identify alternative solutions to traditional offline classes.
- To ensure that students continued receiving academic guidance during the pandemic.
- To support teachers in quickly adapting to online teaching methods.

# The Context:

Situated in rural Alipurduar district, Near to Bhutan Border West, Nani Bhattacharya Smarak Mahavidyalaya (NBSM) serves a student population, many of whom come from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. This posed significant challenges in adopting online learning. The key contextual factors were:

- Creating an environment that was familiar to online learners.
- Providing flexible and adaptable platforms for both students and teachers.
- Ensuring the platforms chosen were accessible and easy to use for rural students.

#### **The Practice:**

After extensive discussions in Teacher Council and IQAC meetings, NBSM adopted the following strategies:

- Separate WhatsApp groups were created for each subject, both for Honours and Programme courses. Students' concerns were addressed through these groups, with more involved cases handled through personal phone communication.
- Classes were conducted on platforms such as Google Meet, Zoom, and WhatsApp video chat. Assignments were distributed, and exams were conducted using these platforms.
- Given the difficulties of holding long, consecutive online classes, teachers also conducted classes on holidays to cover the syllabus.

#### **Evidence of Success:**

Most students and teachers adapted to the new online learning environment quickly. Teachers began to enjoy the online classes, and students managed to adjust despite initial challenges.

#### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

Many students faced difficulties obtaining smartphones due to their economic circumstances, and internet connectivity issues were prevalent in rural areas. To address these challenges, the college uploaded lecture notes to its LMS portal and provided teaching videos on personal and official YouTube channels, sharing the links with students.
